In 2016, we celebrated 25 years as an official non-profit. Incorporated in 1991, CAIN is the result of neighborhood churches answering the call to minister together and continue the legacy of Jewel Davis Smith. In the early 1970's, Jewel began feeding bodies and souls after hearing a sermon by her pastor on God's invitation to insure that all God's people have food, drink, shelter and welcome.

The pantry Jewel founded grew in response to God's call to help those in need. CAIN continues that response today as an oasis in the Northside food desert. We build community and extend compassionate care and hospitality to vulnerable neighbors in need of food, shelter and other essentials. CAIN touches the lives of over 500 households each month through our **Rainbow Choice Food Pantry**; **Phil's Place** weekly dinner; and **Grace Place** shelter for women and children.

As we enter our next 25 years, CAIN is again growing in response to the call for deeper ministry and strengthened community. CAIN's latest endeavor, **Annette's Place**, expands our resources and commitment to comprehensive and compassionate care for 45223 ZIP-code residents of the City of Cincinnati neighborhoods of Northside, Mt. Airy, and South Cumminsille.

We are grateful to all our partners in ministry – past, present and future. Together, we feed bodies and souls.




